Dear Friends in Christ,

I want to thank all of you for the wonderful celebration you shared with me on December 18 as I renewed my vows on the 25th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood.

It was particularly meaningful for me to share the day with some of the people who have been so influential in shaping my life as a Christian and in my role as a pastor of God's people. Fr. Hank Folsom, who is now 85 years old, and who read the gospel at the anniversary service, was very influential in leading both me and my wife to make a commitment to Jesus Christ when we were 26 years old. He sponsored me for seminary and raised a very significant portion of the financial support for my tuition in seminary. He also preached at my ordination service. Fr. Howard was my mentor here at Trinity as I began my ordained ministry after graduating from seminary. I learned from him many practical lessons about pastoral leaderships which I remember and continue to practice to this day. Bishop Josiah, who has been a friend and mentor to me for the past twelve years as I have learned so much from our Christian brothers and sisters who live and demonstrate a heroic faith in the face of great persecution in Nigeria.

I also want to thank Mary Rose, the members of the various adult and children's choirs and the Contemporary Worship Team for leading us in a beautiful and uplifting service of celebration. I had hoped that this service would be a joyful "family reunion" service which incorporated all of our various worship and music styles. It was everything I had hoped it would be, and more. And I want to thank all those who helped organize the lunch celebration after the service and Philippa Mylander who made one of her special creation cakes just for this occasion. It was a wonderful time of fellowship.

Finally, I want to thank all of you who came and joined the celebration. The Church was filled to overflowing and it was wonderful to see our whole parish family together. Thank you all for the many cards and letters of appreciation for my years of ministry here. These letters mean more than any of you can ever imagine. I have them all in a special place and I will re-read them from time to time. I spent the first 18 years of my adult life in the construction business. One of the great things about construction work is tangible results. At the end of a day, you can point to a house and building, a beautiful stone fireplace or a a stone wall and say "Today, I accomplished something. I built that". In parish ministry, tangible results are few and far between. It is not always easy to see what difference you have made. The cards and letters you sent are a tangible reminder of some of the ways that God has used me to have some effect on the lives of others. That is a great encouragement. Thank you all for affording me the great privilege of serving here at Trinity as your pastor. I love this parish and I love all of you. Thank you all for making it so easy to love you.

PLEASE READ! **USING YOUR PLEDGE ENVELOPES CORRECTLY**

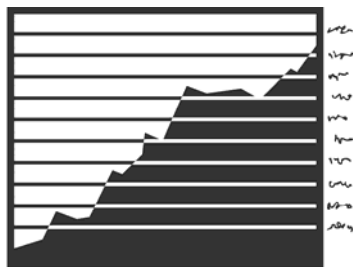

Our Lay Eucharistic Visitor Ministry

What is a Eucharistic Visitor? An Eucharistic visitor is a person who represents the church by being a living reminder that the sick and infirm are an integral part of the church community, which is the body of Christ. One of the main sacramental expressions is bringing His body and blood, Christ's gifts, to parishioners. The Eucharist is the work of the whole Christian community and the Eucharistic visitors are the representatives for those who are unable to worship with their congregation. A visit not only includes the Eucharist but discussions about recent church activities, a bulletin and a devotional.

Trinity Church has had a Eucharistic Visitor Ministry for many years. Deacon Liz began its reactivation and it continues to be revamped and to grow. At present Trinity has 9 Eucharistic visitors. In October members were commissioned with a special blessing also informing parishioners that this ministry is available in times of need. A special thank you to Fr. Jim Gilmore for being our trainer and spiritual adviser.

This ministry is very special to the Eucharistic visitors and in no way usurps the clergy's ministry of visitation. 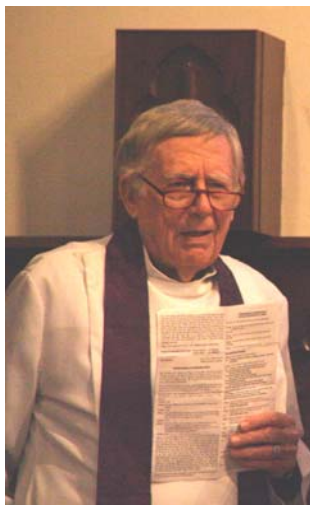

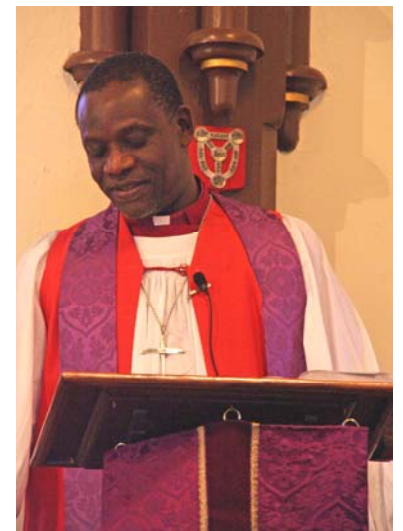
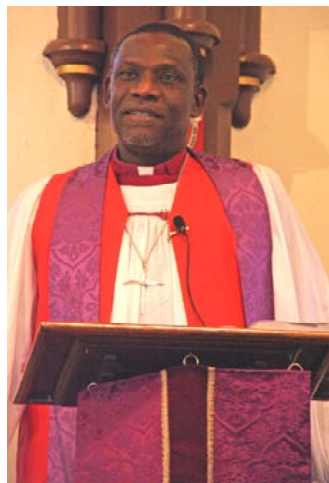
The St. Gregory and Contemporary Choirs provided beautiful and spirit filled worship music with Dan Moskey providing lively piano accompaniment.

Fr. Howard gives a special blessing for Trinity Parish.

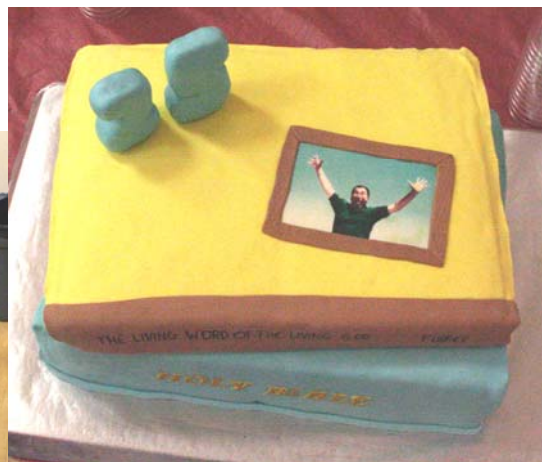
